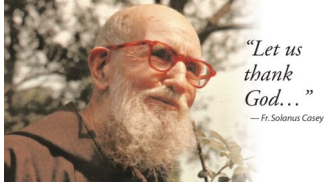

QUOTES FROM POPE FRANCIS

But First in the Heart



Many times, when we examine our conscience, we find some [things] that are truly bad! But [Jesus] carries them. He came for this: to forgive, to make peace in the world, but first in the heart. Perhaps each one of us feels troubled in his heart, perhaps he experiences darkness in his heart, perhaps he feels a little sad over a fault...

He has come to take away all of this. He gives us peace; he forgives everything. "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away sin": he takes away sin, its root and all! This is salvation Jesus brings about by his love and his meekness.

Reflection: Our sins and weakness bring shame, guilt, worry, and fear. Jesus' mercy brings hope, love, and joy. Examine your conscience for a few minutes and consider where you have recently fallen short. Ask God for forgiveness. Free yourself from the bonds of sin. Enter into his mercy.
