Do I Hate Someone?

What is in our heart: is it love? Let us think: do I love my parents, my children, my wife, my husband, people in the neighborhood, the sick? ... Do I love? Is there hate? Do I hate someone? Often we find hatred, don't we? "I love everyone except for this one, this one, and that one!" That's hatred, isn't it? What is in my heart, forgiveness? Is there an attitude of forgiveness for those who have offended me, or is there an attitude of revenge—"he will pay for it!" We must ask ourselves what is within, because what is inside comes out and harms, if it is evil; and if it is good, it comes out and does good.

Reflection: Who is that person in your life you struggle most to love? What needs to change within you so that you can truly love that person? Ask God to help you understand his mercy so that you can give this mercy to others, even those who are the hardest to love.
