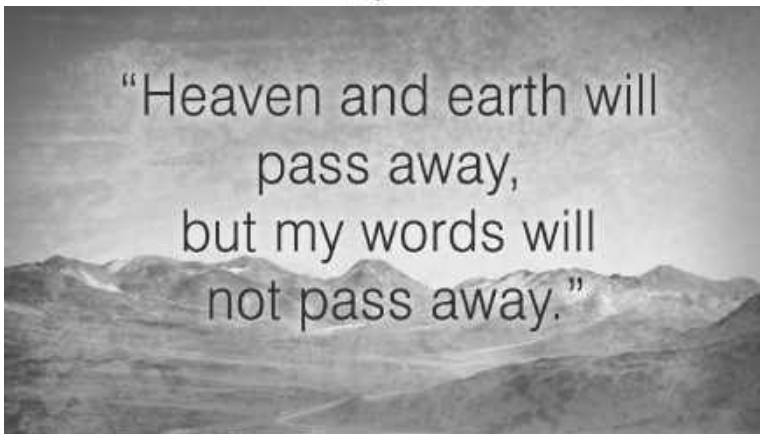

Reflections with Pope Francis

Indifference



Indifference: human indifference causes the needy so much pain! And worse, the indifference of Christians! On the fringes of society so many men and women are tried by indigence, but also by dissatisfaction with life and by frustration. So many are forced to emigrate from their homeland, risking their lives. Many more, every day, carry the weight of an economic system that exploits human beings, imposing on them an unbearable "yoke," which the few privileged do not want to bear.

To each of these children of the Father in heaven, Jesus repeats, "Come to me, all of you." But he also says it to those who have everything, but whose heart is empty and without God. Even to them, Jesus addresses this invitation, "Come to me." Jesus' invitation is for everyone. But especially for those who suffer the most.

Reflection: *Where are you indifferent? Where have you lost the ability to love? What can help you wake up from considering only your needs and wants?*
