- and the *Propagation of the Faith Mission*.

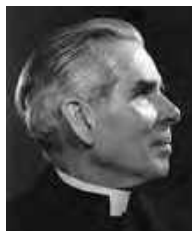

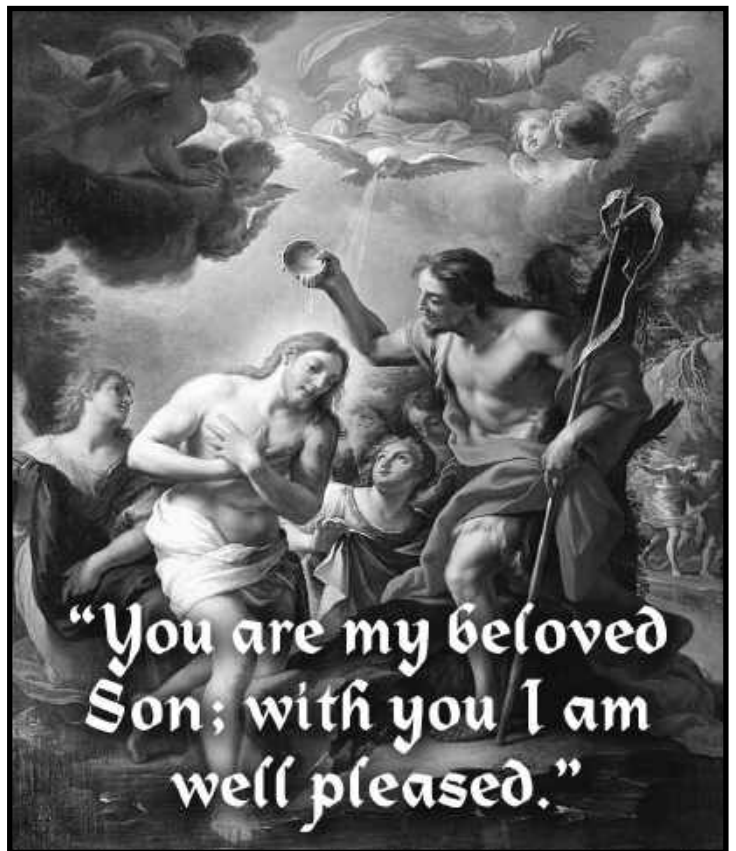
A City on a Hill
