

He Shares in Our Journey



Jesus ... gives himself to us in the Eucharist, shares in our journey, indeed he makes himself food, the true food that sustains our life also in moments when the road becomes hard going and obstacles slow our steps. And in the Eucharist, the Lord makes us walk on his road, that of service, of sharing, of giving; and if it is shared, that little we have, that little we are, becomes riches, for the power of God - which is the power of love - comes down into our poverty to transform it.

Reflection: *Pray in front of the Eucharist for fifteen minutes this week. Ask God to transform you through this great sacrament.*
