The Most Innocent Among Us



Among the vulnerable for whom the Church wishes to care with particular love and concern are unborn children, the most defenseless and innocent among us.... The Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question

It is also true that we have done little to adequately accompany women in very difficult situations, where abortion appears as a quick solution to their profound anguish, especially when the life developing within them is the result of rape or a situation of extreme poverty. Who can remain unmoved before such painful situations?

Reflection: The church's position on abortion is a beautiful stand for human life from its earliest stages. But we must also help women who are in crisis pregnancies. Do you have a pro-life crisis pregnancy center in your area? Ask them what they need and spread the word in your parish.
