at the church starting at 11:00 a.m.



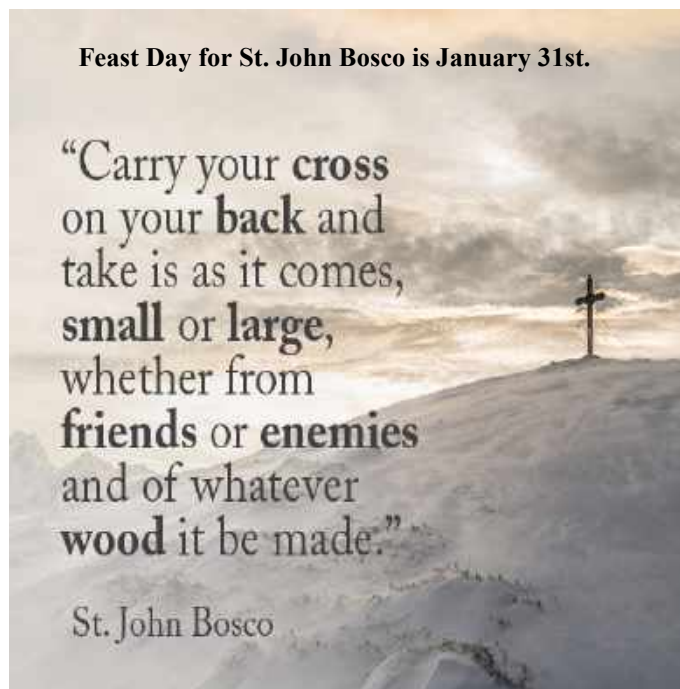
